

**I. BARANGAY PROFILE**

**A. Municipality:** Itogon

Tinongdan is the second biggest barangay of the municipality of Itogon, in the province of Benguet in the Cordillera Administrative Region. Out of the nine barangays of Itogon, Tinongdan is one of the non-mining barangay, instead they give importance about the preservation and practice of culture and traditions. The spectacular sceneries in the entire barangay is considered to be a prime tourist destination in the municipality, wherefore they are known as the “Seat of Cultural Heritage and Natural Wonders”.

**B. Barangay:** Tinongdan

The Barangay hall of Tinongdan is a prominent landmark for visitors, especially for the mountaineers, who ascend and descent from Mount Ugo. The hospitality of the whole community begins at the barangay hall, where visitors who pass through or drop in, is being offered a native coffee, as goodwill to all visitors.

**D. Land Area**

Tinongdan is the second biggest barangay in the municipality of Itogon with an estimated land area of 12,720.37 hectares as per NAMRIA data and 10,171.8183 as per Cadastre data which comprised the 25.13% of the total land area of the town.

**E. Boundaries**

Barangay Tinongdan is adjacent to other places and is bounded on the north of Ambuklao, Bokod; on the south by Dalupirip, Itogon; on the east by Bisal, Bokod and Kayapa, Nueva Vizcaya; and on the west by Poblacion and Loacan, Itogon. The most dominant topography of Tinongdan is rough mountains with slopes ranging from 30 degrees and above. Currently, the Barangay is composed of ninety-three (93) sitios clustered into six (6) puroks. And most of these places are mountainous.

**F. Dialect Spoken**

There are three (3) ethnic groups in the barangay, namely; Ibaloy, Iwak, and Kalanguya. The Ibalois are the major ethnic group and are dominant occupants. Ilocano is a secondary dialect. English and Filipino are the media of instructions in the schools thus the local are adept with these languages.

**G. Livelihood**

Very little from the populace earn from employment in the government agencies and private companies. Most of the people rely on agriculture for subsistence such as farming, backyard gardening, mango production, and livestock raising. Other sources of income include gold panning, Small Medium Enterprises and Ecotourism.

**H. Population**

Tinongdan has a total population of 4,524 (2018 Census) with a voting population of 2,325 and 841 household. Due to its mountain slopes, there are areas where there are no inhabitants.

**Water Resources**

Rivers are found in the area such as, the mighty Agno which runs through sitios Binga-Dipey-Eenat-Imba, Ambalanga River which runs through from Mambolo, Poblacion to sitio Baloy-Tobob, Labey River through sitios Dingey-Dutak-Adonot-Binga, and Kelong River through Mount Ugo to sitio Petican. The presence of many rivers perhaps explains why the people called themselves, *i-kolos* (people from the river banks). This is due to lots of Ibaloy settlement thrived for many centuries on the water system as a source of life sustenance. Aside from the five (5) rivers, there are forty-one (41) listed creeks, thirty-five (35) springs, fourteen (14) waterfalls, two (2) hot springs, and the famous man-made lake, the Binga Dam.
